Lent is the Christian season of spiritual preparation before Easter. For us it begins on Ash Wednesday with the imposition of ashes. During Lent, many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial, and/or spiritual discipline. The intent of the Lenten season is reflection on Jesus Christ; with intentional time set aside to consider his suffering, sacrifice, life, death, burial, and resurrection, which offers us hope in life and death.

I have been reading a book of poetry recently by Solmaz Sharif. A line from one of the poems struck me: "A Life is a thing you have to start." So much of our lives is routine – sleeping, waking, cleaning, working, studying, driving, etc. that we my loose the essence of life. To be a part of a community, to develop friendships, to share our fears and joys, to behold beauty, to expand our mind and experiences and to love. Jesus certainly calls us to start living! He desires that we accept we are loved by God, that we matter and make a difference in this world. To have hope even when there seems to be none. 

#### FINANCE UPDATE – JANUARY 2023

The Finance Committee continues to monitor Jerusalem's financial situation and giving as reflected in our monthly reports.

Current Income for the month of December was \$39,756 and Current Expenses were \$31,012 for a surplus of \$8.744.

Current Income for the year to date was \$224,609 and Current Expenses were \$307,660 for a shortfall of \$83,051.

Total Income for the month of December was \$58,467 and Total Expenses were \$33,862 for a surplus of \$24,605.

Total Income for the year to date was \$267,798 and Total Expenses were \$323,685 for a shortfall of \$55,887.

Attendance for the month of December was 451, an increase of 59 from 2021. Year to date attendance was 2795 an increase of 336 from the total of 2459 in 2021.

We are continuing to withdraw funds from the Foundation Fund in order to cover this shortfall. Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. 1 Peter 4:10
