Pastoral Musings...

"I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." Philippians 3:10-14

We all have goals in life. Sometimes they are clear and strong, other times they are quieter and more instinctual. Goals give us as individuals and as a group purpose and direction. For St. Paul the goal is always to join himself to Christ in his death and resurrection. He accepted the suffering that comes with being a disciple of Jesus. Yes, Jesus gives us life, strength, forgiveness and love, but it comes at a cost to Jesus and to us. To be a disciple is to walk the path Jesus walked. Being a disciple of Jesus takes courage and faith and trust in following where Jesus leads not where the world calls us. Jesus showed this in the desert with the temptation of the devil to have all worldly power, but Jesus knew the only real power is the power found in God. That power is to love and to serve.

There are many voices talking to us at this time and we can be overwhelmed with all the chatter. As we 'forget what lies behind and strain forward to what lies ahead' as St. Paul says we pray to find the beacon of light that will guide us. That beacon is Jesus and fellow disciples who travel with us. Our journey may seem too difficult, but we have Christ with us and with Christ nothing is impossible. We can persevere, we can hold on to hope, we can sort out the chaos and we can hear the one true voice among all the voices – the voice of Jesus. The power is in believing and following Jesus and only him no matter how loud or powerful the voices of the world become. Remember we are the people of the Resurrected One who have been promised the victory of Life.

We have once again celebrated the birth of Jesus into our world, the light that darkness cannot overcome. The Word that cannot be silenced. As we begin a New Year let us choose to have confidence and hope with faith that God will guide us through any hardship, any confusion, any fear so we know the power of His love. Yes, life is different now than just two years back, but there is still life. I truly believe that God will never give up on us or the world that he chose to be a part of in Jesus. We will triumph with our faith and the promise that God has made to be with us in all things. And yes I truly believe that this congregation can not only survive but be reborn in our purpose and given strength to be a beacon of light that witnesses to the power and goodness of God as shown to us in Jesus and sustains us in the Holy Spirit. Let's make a New Year resolution to place our future into God's hands and trust the path God has chosen for us.

DID YOU KNOW ????

In the summer of 1964, as president of Jerusalem Lutheran Church Women, Barbara Renninger attended a conference at Muhlenberg College where a Chrismon Tree was displayed. When she returned home, she asked Pastor Ken Ensminger and Council about the possibility of a Chrismon tree here. The Council paid for original information and patterns and the small white lights. The women donated the styrofoam and the white and gold decorations. A longtime member, Charlie Krause, made a "hot wire" to cut the styrofoam Chrismons and Barbara made cardboard patterns and set up a workspace on her basement ping-pong table to cut all the styrofoam shapes. The women started the work of decorating the Chrismons in September, at the October and November Circle meetings and at a few special work days. By early December the congregation was ready for our first Chrismon (Christian monograms) tree!

FINANCE UPDATE – DECEMBER 2022

The Finance Committee continues to monitor Jerusalem's financial situation and giving as reflected in our monthly reports.

Current Income for the month of November was \$19,544 and Current Expenses were \$24,943 for a shortfall of \$5,399.

Current Income for the year to date was \$184,854 and Current Expenses were \$276,648 for a shortfall of \$91,794.

Total Income for the month of November was \$20,267 and Total Expenses were \$25,293 for a shortfall of \$5,026.

Total Income for the year to date was \$209,331 and Total Expenses were \$290,173 for a shortfall of \$80,842. Attendance for the month of November was 274, an increase of 17 from 2021 Year to date attendance was 2344 an increase of 277 from the total of 2067 in 2021.

We are continuing to withdraw funds from the Foundation Fund in order to cover this shortfall. Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. 1 Peter 4:10

Please give prayerful consideration to how you may be able to serve the Lord at Jerusalem.
