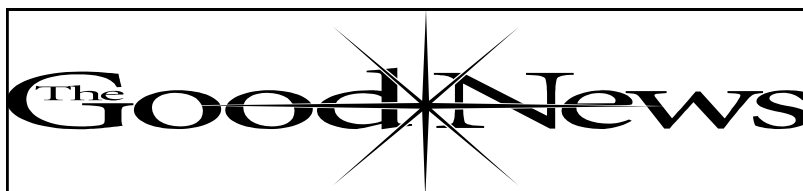

Pastoral Thoughts from Pastor Stan...

Growing up in South Carolina as a Lutheran was a challenge. To say that the Baptist churches outnumbered the Lutheran ones is a large understatement. As the saying goes, throw a rock in any direction and you would hit at least three Baptist Churches! My father grew up Baptist, his father was a lay preacher and his sister was the organist and his brother was a Southern Baptist pastor. So half my family was Lutheran and other half was Baptist. I visited my uncle's church on numerous times including revivals. While serving as a summer chaplain on two ocean front campgrounds in Myrtle Beach I was immersed in the Baptist faith as the vast majority of those that attended services were Southern Baptist. I even remember two ladies coming to me after a service and asking what a Lutheran was. They wanted to know if I was 'born again'. This meant had I accepted Jesus as my personal Lord and Savior. I assured them I was and they asked when my rebirth occurred. I say when I was baptized as an infant. Well, that was not the answer they were looking for. I explained to them that was the day that God had promised me His love and forgiveness and abiding Spirit. You see, I as a Lutheran believe it is God who accepts us not we who accept Him. If we are the one who has to accept God before we are saved then that implies we have power over God. Every aspect of our relationship with God is initiated by God.

I Corinthians 12:3b says '**...no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.**' Consider what this says, we cannot say Jesus is Lord on our own, it is the power of the Holy Spirit within us that speaks through us. On our own we have not the power or strength to say or believe this to be true on our own. The Holy Spirit gives us that strength and power. Martin Luther was very clear about this as well. So we are reborn by the Holy Spirit in our Baptism by the Spirit of God. Our rebirth, our faith is a gift from God given to us by grace. Think about this. We are the recipients of faith and salvation by God's grace. God accepts us before we can even speak the words of faith. If there is a Lutheran motto it would be, 'Saved by grace through faith.' All the power, all the acceptance, all our faith comes from God first. None is dependent on us. And as we realize this amazing gift we have received we called to love and serve God as Jesus teaches us. What an unbelievable gift this is! God loves us first, accepts us, forgives us and empowers us to believe and serve as disciples. Our worship, our study of the Word, our love to neighbor all start with God granting us faith and forgiveness by the Holy Spirit. Let us sing and praise our Lord with all our might and being for all His amazing grace and love for us!

Daily Bread Community Food Pantry

Dear Friends of the Daily Bread Community Food Pantry,

We will be collecting school supplies and backpacks again this year for the children of our clients. We have sincerely appreciated your on-going support of this important project. We are in need of a great many supplies since last year we distributed back packs and school supplies to 303 children. This year the items needed are listed below and the anticipated number of each supply required is also noted:

78 Large Backpacks (distributed to 9th through 12th grade)
85 Medium Backpacks (distributed to 5th through 8th grade)
85 Small Backpacks (distributed to Kindergarten through 4th grade)
30 Plastic pencil boxes (distributed to Kindergarten through 4th grade)
53 Pencil cases for binders (distributed to 5th through 12th grade)
72 Packs of Dividers for binders
54 1" three-ring binders
85 pairs of Fiskar (elementary age) scissors
12 packs of 3x5 lined index cards
40 block erasers (large, usually pink) for elementary age
6 rulers
300 Flash drives



We will begin distributing backpacks and school supplies at the food pantry in August. All donations can be delivered to Daily Bread Community Food Pantry, Monday through Friday from 9 AM-Noon. Since we distribute food to clients on Wednesday mornings from 9 to 11 A.M. you might want to avoid those times.

FINANCE UPDATE –MAY 2023

The Finance Committee continues to monitor Jerusalem's financial situation and giving as reflected in our monthly reports.

Current Income for the month of April was \$22,943 and Current Expenses were \$22,881 which was an overage \$62.

Current Income for the year to date was \$74,369 and Current Expenses were \$93,447 for a shortfall of **\$19,078**.

Total Income for the month of April was \$24,021 and Total Expenses were \$36,544 for a shortfall of **\$24,269**.

Total Income for the year to date was \$77,208 and Total Expenses were \$122,019 for a shortfall of **\$44,811**.

Attendance for the month of April was 659, an increase of 171 over April 2022 although there were 5 Sundays in April 2023 vs 4 Sundays in April 2022. Year to date attendance was 1,913, an increase of 659 from the total of 1,254 in 2022.

We are continuing to withdraw funds from the Foundation Fund in order to cover this shortfall.
