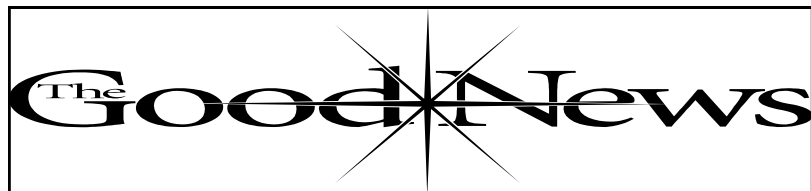

Pastoral Musings...

As I look onto the balcony of the condo I rent, I see the flowers blooming in the potted flower pot I bought. A week ago there were no flowers only brown stems that look dead. You see I had not watered them in a while so they were drying up. I decided to see if I could bring them back so I watered them fairly heavily for several days and waited to see what would happen. Well, most of them came back to life and now have beautiful blooms. A few did die unfortunately and I have to remove them. As I marveled at how resilient the flowers were I also thought of how this was a metaphor for life. Let me explain.

Life is challenging which you all know. At times it seems we are overcome by the challenges and the support we need isn't there so our souls begin to wither along with our hope. Yet in my experience is that at those times I receive the love, guidance and presence I need to replenish myself and begin to live fully again. This does not always occur, but it happened more times than not. I receive water and nourishment that brings my soul to life again and to hope. How does this happen? Well, upon reflection I have recognized certain events that occur.

One such event is that someone notices I am not myself and has the courage and faith to reach out and ask if everything is ok. And if I am strong enough and my ego allows I risk sharing with them that no things are not well. Just knowing they are willing to listen and reflect feels like a cup of cool water on a hot summer day. I also have realized that if I spend time with Jesus in prayer or meditation I discover a peace and strength come over me, another cup of cool water. When I attend worship and give myself to the experience of singing the hymns, listening to the spoken Word and prayers I feel renewed, another cup of cool water. I am sure you can add other examples of how you find sources to renew your spirit. I would love to hear your stories if you are willing to share.

I also feel a source of strength and uplifting when I receive the Sacrament of Bread and Wine. To hear the words, '...given for you/shed for you' reminds me that Jesus is with me in that moment and the moments that follow. We need nourishment for our souls to keep us strong and surrounded by faith. Prayer, meditation, speaking with others, being in community, reading of the Word of God all replenish our hopes and spirit.

Before I end I need to lift up Baptism. It was first here where we received the cool water of God's promise to be with us always and to claim us as his daughter or son. The waters of that day poured out over our heads flow into us today. Martin Luther woke each morning and first made the sign of the cross to remind himself he was a child of God in his baptism. Not a bad way to start a day.

Well, the flowers need watering so I need to go not only to water them but search for those around me who need a cool cup of support and presence. If you are one like these please call and let's get together, I'll bring the water!

Daily Bread Community Food Pantry

Dear Friends of the Daily Bread Community Food Pantry,

We will be collecting school supplies and backpacks again this year for the children of our clients. We have sincerely appreciated your on-going support of this important project. We are in need of a great many supplies since last year we distributed back packs and school supplies to 303 children. This year the items needed are listed below and the anticipated number of each supply required is also noted:

- 78 Large Backpacks (distributed to 9th through 12th grade)
- 85 Medium Backpacks (distributed to 5th through 8th grade)
- 85 Small Backpacks (distributed to Kindergarten through 4th grade)
- 30 Plastic pencil boxes (distributed to Kindergarten through 4th grade)
- 53 Pencil cases for binders (distributed to 5th through 12th grade)
- 72 Packs of Dividers for binders
- 54 1" three-ring binders
- 85 pairs of Fiskar (elementary age) scissors
- 12 packs of 3x5 lined index cards
- 40 block erasers (large, usually pink) for elementary age
- 6 rulers
- 300 Flash drives



We will begin distributing backpacks and school supplies at the food pantry in August. All donations can be delivered to Daily Bread Community Food Pantry, Monday through Friday from 9 AM-Noon. Since we distribute food to clients on Wednesday mornings from 9 to 11 A.M. you might want to avoid those times.

If you, your church or organization would like to help pack the school supplies into plastic bags for distribution at Heidelberg United Church of Christ in Schwenksville beginning mid-July, please contact Anne Ryan, 215-256-4448. Again, our sincere, heartfelt thank you for your generous support of this valuable project!

A number of years ago Lutheran Church Women made the confirmation banner shown as a gift from the congregation to each confirmand. The banner was accompanied by the letter below. This year Confirmation Sunday was held on June 4, 2023. We thank Nancy Arnold for making the banner this year.

We give you this banner to remind you of who you are.

Baptized into Christ, you are a member of His body together with all other believers in Him. This is the most blessed and precious membership you could ever wish to hold. Treasure it always!

The red of the banner is the liturgical color used for the Day of Pentecost and it symbolizes the flames of fire seen at the time of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples in Jerusalem. The white descending dove stands for the Holy Spirit – white symbolizing the purity of God. The gold trim refers to God's majesty and glory.

You are the very temple of the Holy Spirit who lives in you and so you have the peace and joy of knowing that His strength, guidance, love and power are yours. Treasure the Spirit!

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS –JUNE 2023

Members in attendance in person were Caesar Gorski, Norma Grosick, Janet Luyben, and Tony Damiani. Andy Englehart and Pastor Stan attended via Teams.

- ♦ **Special Order of Business** – Michael Mancini gave a presentation (copy attached) recommending that we add a dedicated Internet service to the sanctuary. Pastor got the cost of \$147 per month. On motion by Pastor, seconded by Norma, the recommendation passed with Caesar abstaining. Michael Mancini also advised that he is donating equipment that he purchased to supply wireless internet to the Narthex area.
- ♦ **Finance** - Caesar made a motion on behalf of Finance to use 40% of the Bernie Slemmer bequest of \$25,000 to current. Second by Norma. Unanimous vote in agreement. \$10,000 will go to current. A recommendation was made by finance to include a financial update in the bulletins every week.
- ♦ **Worship and Music** – Questioned whether to continue offering prepackaged wafers and grape juice for communion. Options discussed included stopping or using up current supply and stop offering after June 30.
- ♦ **Property** - Will proceed with the repair work that does not require permitting. Caesar will generate deposit check for 1/3 of the \$27,800 work mentioned above (\$9,174.00).
- ♦ **Unfinished Business** - Pastor advised that Michael DiDominico agreed to assist Chris Freer with the Ensminger Scholarship Fund. Pastor will get Chris, Michael, and the Souders together to work through the details.
- ♦ **New Business** - There were three individuals that went to Lay Minister training. The cost of \$30.00 per person will be reimbursed. Norma said she doesn't want to be reimbursed. Norma advised that the Fall Festival is set for October 7th at the Olszanowski Farm. Cost will be \$17 and includes Hayrides, Corn Maze, and hot dogs and snacks.
Norma will have the puppets perform a skit in early September to encourage members of the congregation to consider serving on Council.

Finance Committee

FINANCE UPDATE –JUNE 2023

The Finance Committee continues to monitor Jerusalem's financial situation and giving as reflected in our monthly reports.

Current Income for the month of May was \$22,519 and Current Expenses were \$35,227 which was a shortfall of **\$12,708**.

Current Income for the year to date was \$96,888 and Current Expenses were \$128,674 for a shortfall of **\$31,786**.

Total Income for the month of May was \$30,548 and Total Expenses were \$38,017 for a shortfall of **\$7,469**.

Total Income for the year to date was \$107,756 and Total Expenses were \$160,036 for a shortfall of **\$52,258**.

Attendance for the month of May, was 289, an increase of 39 over May 2022. Year to date attendance was 2,202, an increase of 698 from the total of 1,504 in 2022.

We are continuing to withdraw funds from the Foundation Fund in order to cover this shortfall.
