

### Martin Luther's Seal (or the Luther Rose)

Luther's seal, or as it is sometimes called, Luther's Rose, is the most widely known symbol of Lutheranism. Luther was invited to create a personal symbol to summarize his faith in 1520. As his writings became increasingly popular, there was a desire on the part of the Wittenberg printers to somehow indicate what was an authorized publication of Luther's works. So, they asked Luther to tell them what he would like to have as his personal mark on his published works which is shown below. The meaning of each of the parts of the Seal are explained below as well.



<b>Black Cross</b>		Symbolizes Jesus' death and pain and reminds us that faith in Jesus is what saves us. "For one who believes from the heart will be justified" –Rom 10:10
<b>Red Heart</b>		Even though the cross is black, it does not kill our hearts, but makes us alive. "The just shall live by faith" – Rom 1:17
<b>White Rose</b>		Faith in Jesus brings true joy, consolation and peace, not worldly joy and peace – John 14:27. White is the color of angels and blessed spirits.
<b>Blue Sky</b>		Symbolizes our hope for the coming joys of heaven, though not yet revealed.
<b>Gold Rim</b>		As a circle is unending, so the joys of heaven will be unending. Its gold color reminds us that the joys of heaven are more precious than any other treasure.

### *Pastoral Musings...*

As we all know, life can be very unpredictable. Everything seems fine and each day follows the next and then out of nowhere there is a call, a diagnosis, an accident, a financial issue that overwhelms us so we then feel as if we have lost our bearing and our security. There are more questions than answers, uncertainty rather than confidence, loneliness in place of belonging. We all react differently at such times, some of us reach out for support and help, others pull back and hope it will all go away. As people of faith we may grow even stronger in our faith or we may lose our faith. I know because I have experienced such times myself and I have been with others as they face such times. As a Pastor I struggle to understand or to explain to myself or to you how/why these things occur.

Some I know would like for me to say it is God's will or according to his plan. At least there would seem to be someone who can explain the unexplainable. But I cannot say this as it implies these things occur/caused by God's will which would mean God causes pain and death. All I can say with certainty is that God comes to us in such times to give us courage and hope for God is a God of life who through Jesus understands how we feel, understands fear and pain. The God we worship is a God of life!

God does this by sending his Spirit to us as well as his angels who are those that reach out to help us and remind us we are not alone. I have seen this in Jerusalem especially recently. I have seen many of you be the messengers of God's love and presence through your prayers, the calls you make, the visits, the cards, the sharing of food all of which are signs of God being present with us through others. At such times we become the church, Christ's body on earth who bring healing and compassion to those who call out for God's strength. As a church we do many things such as worship, serve, teach, sing, have fellowship, study, pray and much more. But the presence and support we give to those who have had their life turned upside down is the most visible sign of Christ's presence in the world.

So thank you for your faithfulness and care for each other. Thank you for your prayers and comfort you offer. Thank you for being present to each other. We are his messengers and angels who come to those hurting and alone to assure them God is indeed present. God who suffers in our suffering and who walks with us in the darkness to the light he creates within and around us. Please continue to be there for each other and to allow others to be there for you. For when we gather in service in the name of Jesus he is present as the resurrected Son of God. Hold to each other in prayer knowing Jesus is not only listening but is present with you.



## ***Finance Committee***

### **FINANCE UPDATE – SEPTEMBER 2023**

The Finance Committee continues to monitor Jerusalem's financial situation and giving as reflected in our monthly reports.

Current Income for the month of August was \$14,790 and Current Expenses were \$21,964 which was a shortfall of **\$7,174**.

Current Income for the year to date was \$145,205 and Current Expenses were \$206,107 for a shortfall of **\$60,902**.

Total Income for the month of August was \$15,364 and Total Expenses were \$23,964 for a shortfall of **\$8,600**.

Total Income for the year to date was \$165,212 and Total Expenses were \$268,569 for a shortfall of **\$103,357**.

Attendance for the month of August was 225, an increase of 59 over August 2022. Year to date attendance was 3,033, an increase of 878 from the total of 2,155 in 2022.

We have liquidated \$34,000 from the Foundation Fund, with more anticipated, and \$43,000 from the Building Fund. It is important to note that the more that is liquidated from the reserve accounts, the less income that these reserves will generate!
