

Pastoral Musings...



When we were younger we all had dreams and expectations about what our life would be when we were older. Each of us can describe what those dreams were. Now that many of us are 'older' (anyway you wish to describe older) we are living our once upon a time future. We are at different stages of our journey, some are at the beginning making plans, some are in the midst of journey where we are set on a path and some are closer to the end of the journey. No matter where we are in the journey we reflect on what has occurred, where we are in the present and how we plan for the future. If you are like me then your present is far from the dreams of our youth. I could never had

expected to have lived in Egypt or Harlem. I certainly did not expect to have been in the north for my whole adult life. And I didn't even know there was a Schwenksville! My life has been more complicated than I expected with experiences and challenges I could never have predicted.

The disciples of Jesus knew about an unexpected future. Their vision of Jesus was nowhere close to who he truly was. The idea that they would be the founders and leaders of a movement that would change the world were laughable. Jesus took them to a place beyond their imagination, even beyond what they thought or believed about God. Their lives were forever changed. They heard Jesus' call and without thinking they followed even when they were confused about what Jesus was saying or doing. They followed because he called them to follow. They stayed even when confused because Jesus gave them hope and meaning. None of us could have forecasted with accuracy how our lives would turn out. We made decisions we felt were best at the time with each decision leading us to another. Our best decisions were made when we felt confident, our most exciting decisions when we took risks, and weakest decisions when we were fearful or anxious. Look at the disciples before the resurrection and see how different they were after the resurrection.

We are on this side of the resurrection. We confess that Jesus overcame death and grave to give us life and hope. Yet, at times we falter and stumble out of uncertainty or fear. We are also on the other side of the Covid Pandemic and we do not understand why things are different. We are confused that what was before is not now. Where are our friends who were here with us before? Why have they not returned? Will we be strong enough to maintain our presence? These questions are fair and to a large extend I have no answer. The one answer I do have is that the same God that was with us before is with us now. The same message of hope and love is still present. As the disciples could not turn back after they had witnessed the risen Christ we cannot turn back either. The future is our path and we may not know exactly how it will develop, we do know we will continue to hold to our faith and to Jesus. Hopefully, we know that God will lead us to new adventures and new mission. Our best days may very well lie ahead.

So like the disciples we continue on this new journey serving God and neighbor knowing that the way may be different than we expected, but it is still the way God leads us and transforms us. Let us turn our heads from the past and look to the future in hope and expectancy.

Mutual Ministry

A new Sunday School year will begin soon. Anyone who plans to volunteer in any activities that include being with children under 18 must have background clearances. This is the law in the State of Pennsylvania. Clearances should be put in a sealed envelope in the Mutual Ministry mailbox in the Cloister or given to Marcia Ehrhart.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VOLUNTEERS To Keep Jerusalem Evangelical Lutheran Church in Compliance with CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES LAW (CPSL) 23 Pa.C.S. Section 6344.2

Cursor down to the box and check "Clearances"

Cursor down and see:

- Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance
- Pennsylvania State Police Criminal History Clearance
- <u>Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) Criminal History Clearance</u> (required for all employees and some volunteers)

Everyone needs the Child Abuse and Criminal History clearances. Click on each one and follow directions. The FBI clearance is required for anyone who has not lived in Pennsylvania for the last 10 years.

You may receive a confirmation after completing the two clearances. These are not the official results. You will receive your clearance by mail to your home. It is your responsibility to keep the clearance for your own records and give a copy to Mutual Ministry (either give to a member of the Committee or put in a sealed envelope in the Mutual Ministry mailbox in the Cloister. Child abuse information is confidential and may not be released to other individuals. Therefore, MM will keep clearances in a locked file. It is important that your keep your copy in case it is needed for other purposes.

For those who prefer to use a paper submission or who do not have access to a computer and internet, contact Marcia Ehrhart @ marciaehrhart 4@gmail.com or 610-287-7176.

Clearances are good for five years, and you can apply for a new (free) clearance 3 months prior to the five-year anniversary of your clearances.

Additionally, each Volunteer must sign and have witnessed the DISCLOSURE STATEMENT APPLICATION FOR VOLUNTEERS which is also required by the CPSL. Copies of this document will be placed in the Narthex.

Please make sure this document is printed on both sides of one page, not two pages.

Pastor's:

FINANCE UPDATE – AUGUST 2023

The Finance Committee continues to monitor Jerusalem's financial situation and giving as reflected in our monthly reports.

Current Income for the month of July was \$17,883 and Current Expenses were \$23,121 which was a shortfall of \$5,238.

Current Income for the year to date was \$130,415 and Current Expenses were \$184,143 for a shortfall of \$53,728.

Total Income for the month of July was \$33,234 and Total Expenses were \$42,964 for a shortfall of \$9,730.

Total Income for the year to date was \$149,848 and Total Expenses were \$244,605 for a shortfall of \$94,757.

Attendance for the month of July, was 278, an increase of 61 over July 2022. Year to date attendance was 2,808, an increase of 819 from the total of 1,989 in 2022.

We are continuing to withdraw funds from the Foundation Fund in order to cover this shortfall.
