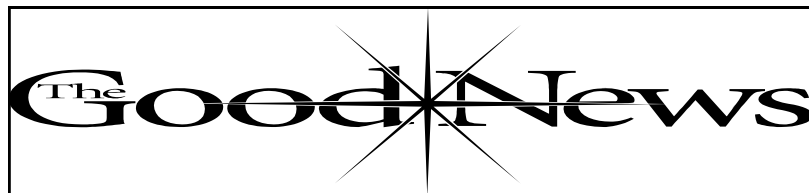

Pastor's Page



My Dear Brothers and Sisters of Jerusalem Lutheran Church, Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Do you have any stories that you tell over and over again? Or maybe stories that you love to listen to over and over again? I am blessed to have a group of friends from college that I have stayed in touch with over the years, and while I don't get to see them nearly as much as I would like to, often when we do get together we end up telling some of the same stories again and again. They are stories that we all know, many of which happened nearly 20 years ago, and yet they are worth re-telling because of the joy they bring to each of us (our wives might not find the stories as entertaining as we do).

I think we all have those stories in our lives that bring us joy that we can't help but keep returning to again and again. Perhaps it's a favorite book that you never seem to tire of no matter how many times you read it. I've never been a big re-reader of books but this year I've started to do that more and it's been really fun to come back to familiar books and discover hidden details that I had missed the first time through. Perhaps for you it's not a favorite book but a favorite movie or show that you love to rewatch, something that speaks to your heart, moves you to tears or laughter, a story that no matter how many times you watch it you just don't seem to get tired of it. Stories are powerful, they can become a part of us, transform the way we think and see, and the stories that we choose to revisit often impact us even more deeply.

As I write this article I am in the process of preparing for Holy Week which is a time in the church year where we set aside time to tell the same story again. If you've been around the church at all throughout your life then you already know the story but I suspect, if you're anything like me, you don't mind hearing it again. It's a story that is worth telling over and over again, a story about new life, about God's love for the world, and about death not being the end of the story.

There's an old hymn that I love titled "I Love To Tell The Story" and it always seems to come to my mind during Holy Week. I find myself humming it or singing it to myself as I prepare for the various worship services. I've been thinking about one verse in particular recently that goes like this:

I love to tell the story;
For those who know it best
Seem hungering and thirsting
To hear it like the rest.
And when, in scenes of glory,
I sing the new, new song,
'Twill be the old, old story,
That I have loved so long.

So as we enter into Holy Week, and we tell the old old story of Jesus and his love once again, I hope and pray that you get as much joy from hearing it as I do. That this story might serve to move you, inspire you, and encourage you once again, and that you might even discover something new, a detail you hadn't picked up on before that reveals a truth about the story that enhances it even more.

May the Grace and Peace of Christ, our Paschal Lamb, the one who has defeated death and the grave, be with you throughout Holy Week and the Easter season.

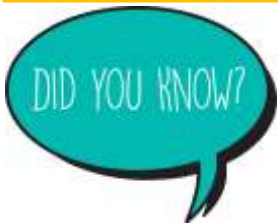

Council Highlights

The March 17, 2026, council meeting covered several property maintenance and facility management approvals. The council approved a \$2,500 project to paint all exterior doors on the church building, as well as a nearly \$20,000 project for the interior and exterior painting and floor refurbishing of the 291 Second Street property.

A strong emphasis was also placed on upcoming fellowship and community outreach events. The council approved a Palm Sunday Community Pancake Breakfast and Easter Egg Hunt for March 29th, a church cleanup day on April 18th, and hosting a dinner on April 24th. Other upcoming highlights include a "Wonderful Women" brunch scheduled for May 3rd, a Music Appreciation Sunday on May 17th, and a Family Trivia event on May 30th. Finally, the council reviewed its top priorities for 2026, which include establishing relationships with St. James and other local churches, expanding monthly community meals while ensuring kitchen food safety compliance, and continuing their bi-monthly cooking efforts for the homeless.
