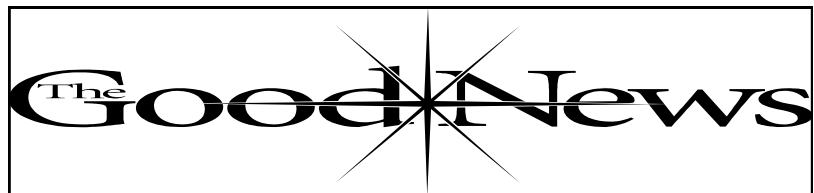

Title: **(Extra) Ordinary Time**

Lately I've been thinking a bit about seasons, particularly the change of seasons. As we make our way to the end of the season of spring and the beginning of the season of summer, or as we quickly reach the end of the school year and the start of summer vacation, I am very mindful that over the next month the pace of life is going to change a bit. In the midst of this we are also experiencing a change of seasons in church as we transition from the season of Easter into the season of Ordinary Time, and so for this newsletter article I thought I might take a moment to share a bit about what the season of Ordinary Time is all about, and how it might be a bit extraordinary as well.

So let's just start with why this season is called Ordinary Time, and to do that we have to talk a bit about how we count. This might be a review from grade school, but there are two different ways that we count: using cardinal numbers like one, two, three, four, or using ordinal numbers like first, second, third, fourth. This season is referred to as Ordinary Time because it uses ordinal numbers to identify which Sunday we are on—for example, the Fifth Sunday after Pentecost. The ordinal number is key to identifying which day we are on.

Now I think another common use of the word "ordinary" is to imply that something is not special or is somehow boring, but I don't think that's necessarily the case with the season of Ordinary Time. Sure, on some level everyday life is often quite ordinary, perhaps seeming unexciting or average, but I think there is real beauty in that. The ordinary nature of everyday life makes the extraordinary moments stand out that much more. If, for example, every day were like Christmas, then Christmas wouldn't feel very special at all. The contrast between Christmas and everyday life is part of what makes Christmas beautiful.

So Ordinary Time reflects the pattern of the church year, the ebbs and flows as we move from one season to another. The church year begins with the season of Advent, which builds to the feast of Christmas. After Christmas we celebrate one of several "transition Sundays," a feast day before the change of seasons, as we celebrate the Baptism of Our Lord. We then transition back to Ordinary Time for several weeks before we reach another transition Sunday, Transfiguration of Our Lord, and then begin our journey through the season of Lent. The season of Lent culminates in Holy Week and the celebration of the Great Fifty Days of Easter. Then, as the Easter season concludes with the celebration of Pentecost, we celebrate our third transition Sunday, Trinity Sunday, which as of the writing of this article we are about to celebrate. Following Trinity Sunday we return to Ordinary Time for our longest stretch of the church year, which takes us all the way to the end of the year and our final transition Sunday, Christ the King. This Ordinary Time season does contain within it a couple of feast days, such as Reformation and All Saints, but for the most part we are in Ordinary Time from May/June through November.

So what happens during Ordinary Time? Well, I think the chosen color of Ordinary Time gives us a pretty good idea. Ordinary Time is the green season of the church, and green is often seen as the color of life—the color of growing plants and trees, the color of spring and summer, the color of gardens growing and producing food. My wife Katie is currently doing a lot of work in the garden at our house and slowly trying to nurture the growth of her young plants. While it might not look like much right now, we know that will change very soon as these plants root and grow.

I think this image is particularly appropriate for the season of Ordinary Time, a season where we journey together through the Scriptures, learning about the work of God in this world, seeing God at work in our own lives, and continuing to grow in faith. Just as this is a season where we look to the garden and see life bursting forth, likewise in our own lives we can do the same: inviting God to help us grow in new and exciting ways, praying for God's guidance in pruning away what is hindering our growth, allowing our faith to be transformed, and the Spirit to produce an abundance of fruit in our lives.

From that perspective, Ordinary Time doesn't sound very dull or boring at all, but actually rather exciting, energizing, and even quite extraordinary after all.

May the grace and peace of Christ be with you throughout this season of Ordinary Time.

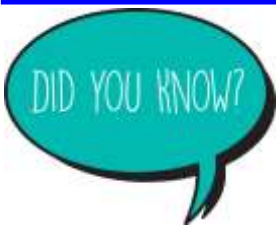

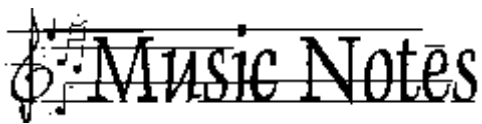

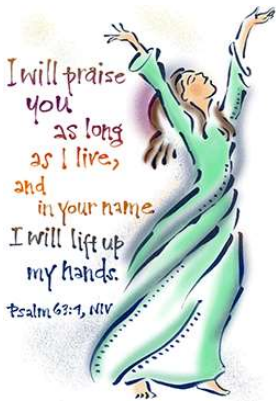
