

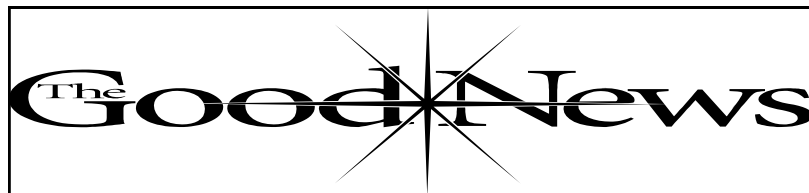

Pastor's Page



"How's It Going?"

We're now three months into this shared ministry between Jerusalem and St. James, and there's one question I hear a lot:

"So how is it going, sharing your time between two congregations?"

I feel like I encounter this question all the time. Whether it's from members of Jerusalem or St. James, friends and colleagues, or even my own family, I get asked this on a regular basis. Now, don't get me wrong, I think it's a great question and I also understand where it's coming from. Together we have embarked on this new adventure/experiment, and so there is understandably some curiosity about how it's working, whether everything is going smoothly, and if it isn't, how we might adjust things to work better. I have also appreciated that a great deal of the concern behind this question has been for me personally, checking

in to make sure that I'm not overdoing it or burning myself out (which I'm happy to report that I am not).

So I figured that I would take the time in this newsletter article to reflect on the answer to that question. As I write this, we are exactly three months into this new arrangement and I am happy to report that, from my perspective, things are going great. Certainly it has been an adjustment—being in two places on Sunday, for example, took some getting used to—but now that we've developed a routine everything feels natural. Likewise, figuring out how to work out of two different offices took some getting used to as well, but just like with worship, once I developed a routine and a schedule everything has worked out very smoothly. I've even been able to get out to visit all of our homebound members and bring them communion, which has been a real joy and has allowed me to meet those members that we don't see as frequently. One of the things this has taught me is to embrace a different rhythm—more like a marathon than a sprint—and to trust that care can still be faithful and meaningful, even when it doesn't happen on the exact timeline I first imagined.

This gets to another question that I have gotten, which is: "How do you manage the workload of two congregations?" To that question I have a two-part answer. The first answer has to do with pacing. The truth is, because I am splitting my time between two places, the work that I am doing for each congregation has to be paced a little differently. For example, my hope was to have visited all of our homebound members before Easter, but unfortunately, because of the pace at which I was able to go and the other demands on my time during Lent, I had to visit a few people after Easter. I was still able to visit everyone; I just had to change the pace at which I accomplished that. It has been a spiritual lesson as much as a logistical one: God is at work even when our schedules shift, and ministry doesn't stop being ministry just because it doesn't line up perfectly with our calendars.

The other part of the answer to the question of how I manage the workload of two congregations is that I really don't manage the workload of two congregations—at least not by myself. The truth is, both Jerusalem and St. James are blessed with an incredible number of dedicated staff and volunteers who do so much for each congregation, and I am blessed to serve alongside you all. This means that while I play a role in the congregation, I am by no means responsible for it all. This is an incredible blessing and makes serving both congregations not only possible, but a joy.

So, as a part of this newsletter article, I would like to take a moment to express my gratitude to you all. To our incredible staff, our council members, our finance committee, property committee, worship and music committee; those who serve on the Day Care School Board, the Care Team that visits our homebound members, those who teach Sunday School and Confirmation, and lead music ministries; those who cook meals for the congregation and those in need; the people who showed up for the work day; those who regularly mow the grass and care for the grounds; the people who serve in the nursery during worship on Sunday morning—thank you.

There are so many people that I didn't even want to begin listing names because I was afraid I would miss someone, and I also know that many of you serve in more than one of those ways. Truthfully, you are the ones who make ministry possible in this community, and I am grateful and privileged to be able to join you in that amazing work.

Finally, and most importantly, all of this is made possible because of the grace and presence of our God who is with us every step of the way. I truly believe that it was God who called us into this, it is God who continues to empower and sustain us, and it is God who will continue to lead us forward. Without God none of this would be possible, and with God, as the Scriptures tell us, all things are possible.

So the short answer to the question "How is it going?" is that it's really going great. But I want you to know that every time I answer that question by saying how great things are, I'm only able to say that because of the grace of God who has called me to this place, and because of you. So thank you from the bottom of my heart for all that you do to make this the wonderful community that it is. It most definitely wouldn't be the same, or as great, without you.

May the grace and peace of Christ be with you all.

Did You Know....

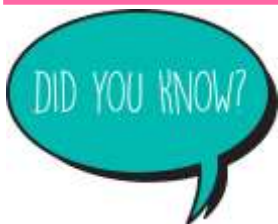
Ott’s Sunrise Easter Service
